At Life College's TILE (Transition to Independent Living and Employment) program, we help young adults with intellectual disabilities including, but not limited to, Autism, Fragile X, Brain Injury, and other Developmentally Delayed Learners.

The goal is to transition our students from dependent living through a college experience to prepare them for gainful employment and independent living.

Our Life College internship program will teach students transferable job skills for careers in industries such as automotive, child development, computer software development, leisure and hospitality, light manufacturing, healthcare, office administration, transportation, and warehousing while demonstrating the soft skills necessary to maintain gainful employment.

- Internship experience








Our Vision
